JOB OVERVIEW

Camp Banting provides children and youth living with type 1 diabetes with an unforgettable overnight summer camp experience in a medically supervised, safe and supportive environment.

Camp Banting works to empower youth with diabetes to lead their best lives in an environment that allows kids to be kids. We are proud to provide programming that inspires confidence, support, and hope for children with diabetes and their families.

The Camp Dietitian will live on-site at Camp Banting, hosted by Camp Davern in Maberly, Ontario for the duration of their contract. This position will work with the kitchen team, campers, the medical team, and the counselling team. They will be responsible for overseeing the dietetic well-being of campers, including general carbohydrate counting and one on one camper/staff support and instruction. Camp Dietitians work closely with the Kitchen team on food safety, portioning, and food delivery. They will be responsible for some food preparation. The Camp Dietitians will work closely with other dietetic staff and medical staff, and the Kitchen team..

Camp Dietitian(s) report directly to the Dietetic Coordinator.

COMMITMENT:

- 1 and 2-week contract options: June 28th-July 4th, July 6th-11th, or June 28th-July 11th. Contract dates will be determined with the Dietetic Coordinator directly
- In person training and program development: June 28th and 29th
- On-site living for duration of camp contract while overseeing dietetic-related care
- Meals and accommodation included.

WHAT YOU'LL BE DOING:

- Reviewing food items with respect to camper/staff dietary restrictions and carbohydrate content
- Liaison with kitchen team to confirm recipes and ensure portion are appropriately sized
- Assisting campers with carbohydrate counting and providing substitutions as needed
- Role model positive behaviour to campers and workforce to establish supportive experience for participants
- Ensure in-scope care of campers
- Actively contribute to our culture of inclusion and diversity by ensuring that all staff and campers feel represented and heard
- Other roles and responsibilities as required by Camp Banting

KEY REQUIREMENTS:

• Knowledge of carbohydrate containing foods and how to obtain relevant information from food labels, Canadian Nutrient File (or similar)

- Ability to identify priority allergen containing foods and appropriate food safe handling techniques
- Clear communication with dietetic team, campers, kitchen team and medical staff
- Ability to take initiative, problem solve and work as a team member
- Experience or understanding of type 1 diabetes and its medical, social, and emotional impact, or a willingness to learn
- Experience working with populations with a range of accessibility needs; preferred
- Previous experience in camping/youth recreation; preferred

- Mental Health First Aid; preferred
