JOB OVERVIEW

Camp Banting provides children and youth living with type 1 diabetes with an unforgettable overnight summer camp experience in a medically supervised, safe and supportive environment.

Camp Banting works to empower youth with diabetes to lead their best lives in an environment that allows kids to be kids. We are proud to provide programming that inspires confidence, support, and hope for children with diabetes and their families.

The Camp Nurse(s) will live on-site at Camp Banting, hosted by Camp Davern in Maberly, Ontario for the duration of their contract. This position will work with campers, the medical team and the counselling team. They will be responsible for overseeing the medical well-being and safety of campers, including support with basic nursing care as required, as well as day-to-day diabetes management (assistance with insulin delivery, pump site changes, ketone test, etc). The Camp Nurse(s) will work closely with other nurses, and members of the medical team.

Camp Nurse(s) report directly to the Nursing Coordinator.

COMMITMENT:

- Contract dates will be determined with the Nursing Coordinator directly
- In person training and program development: to be coordinated in advance of the camp sessions.
- On-site living for duration of camp contract while overseeing nursing-related care and well-being of campers.
- Meals and accommodation included.

WHAT YOU'LL BE DOING:

Under the direction and supervision of the medical team:

- Supervise and administer insulin injections
- Supervise and complete pump site changes
- Assist and support Night Monitor in overnight rounds
- Documentation of care
- Role model positive behaviour to campers and workforce to establish supportive experience for participants
- Promote and foster camper independence in diabetes care
- Ensure the physical and medical safety of campers
- Actively contribute to our culture of inclusion and diversity by ensuring that all staff and campers feel represented and heard
- Other roles and responsibilities as required by Camp Banting

KEY REQUIREMENTS:

- Ability to take initiative, problem solve and work as a team member
- Experience or understanding of type 1 diabetes and its medical, social, and emotional impact, or a willingness to learn
- Willingness to work outside of a traditional nursing environment
- Experience working with populations with a range of accessibility needs; preferred

- Ability to communicate in English and French; preferred

- Criminal Record Search including vulnerable sector check (once hired)
- Mental Health First Aid; preferred
